Fire Water Upgrade

Next week an upgrade to our fire water system will commence. This will involve decommissioning and removal of the old cement fire water tanks and pump system, a partial upgrade of the oval irrigation, complete upgrade of the generator and pump and two new fire water-tanks. The tanks will be far larger than the existing tanks and will be located on the primary oval area near the bus bay. Although we will lose some of the oval, it is the best place to locate the tanks. This area will also be fenced for safety reasons.

This project has been in the investigation and planning phase for 4 years so it will be great to see it finally happening. All care will be taken to ensure the school is fire safe while the project is ongoing until completion, which is estimated to be around the end of term 4.

In English this year, students have travelled through the ages, experiencing different genres. Year 7 and 8 students began in ancient Greece, looking at heroes, and found themselves on the summit of Mount Everest, while the Year 9 class visited the fantasy realm of fairytales. Year 10 students found themselves immersed in World War 2, and Year 11 and 12 students slipped forward in time to a dystopian future. Students also improved their own writing repertoire.

Not all experiences are found within the pages of books though, and this year students have immersed themselves in literature in other ways. The Year 7, 8 and 9 classes presented some of their work to parents at the end of Semester 1, with the 7s and 8s sharing their experience of the class novel and the 9s exhibiting their journey into the world of Shakespeare. The Year 10 class enhanced their study of the Bard by traveling to Melbourne to see Belle Shakespeare's production of Macbeth. The company then visited the school during Book Week with two performances. Years 4 to 8 students saw the very funny rendition of Just Macbeth, a children's version of the play, written by author, Andy Griffith. Year 9 and 10 students experienced Such Sweet Sorrow and are ready to now delve into the pages of Romeo and Juliet. The Year 11/12 English class travelled to Mount Gambier to see the return season of the play Euphoria, which delves into the joys and worries of life in a country town. These experiences have been enjoyed by all the students, who have gained a new appreciation for some of the texts they read.
