




















A crucial session for all parents.

Your family and our school community need you to attend.

Over 600 teenagers are injured on our roads each year - You can do something about it!

If your child has their Learners Licence (or is due to get it this year) then this will be an essential session for you as a parent or carer.

Parents are most likely to provide much of the driver education for their child, think about this;

- Do you know how to develop and build their driving experiences?
- Do you know how to reduce the risk of crashing or change the severity of the outcome?
- Are you really prepared for the task of supervising a novice driver?
- Have you kept up-to-date with road rule changes?
- Do you know what to look for in a Driving Instructor?
- Do you know what to look for regarding your child's first car?

Many South Australians believe that road fatalities and serious injuries are the result of risk taking or extreme behaviours. However, research shows that more than half of fatal crashes and 90% of injury crashes are due to mistakes, inattention or common lapses in judgement. Researchers believe that too many young drivers are not being taught well enough or equipped with enough skills and knowledge to drive safely.

Simply increasing awareness of the dangers of high-risk driving does not necessarily lead to less risky behaviours. Save A Life Australia (an independent road safety company) has developed a longer-term approach, which we believe will help to make our families safer on the road.

This highly acclaimed program is coming to our school. The program involves students AND parents and is presented by Darren Davis (ABC Radio road safety expert and Get Home Safe Foundation President).

It is essential that you attend our parents/supervising drivers evening session and help to make our whole school community more aware of how to make our new drivers better equipped for a safe driving future! The parent's session will last for approximately one hour and is an informal discussion-based session that could make a real difference to your family.

We do NOT sell lessons or advertise any driving school. This session is to help parents with their choices.

Gratitude

Paying attention to what we have.

Now that we are across what it means, it's time to action it!

Some benefits of practising gratitude are:

- After 21 days, you start to scan the world for positives.
- After 42 days, you become:
 - More optimistic, energised & focused.
 - Less likely to get sick.
 - You will sleep better.
 - Anxiety and depression decreases.

A few quick and simple ways to practise being grateful are:

- Journalling at the end of each day (maybe before going to sleep), write down 3 things that went well for you that day or follow some of these prompts:
 - What is one good thing that I often take for granted?
 - What do I appreciate about myself?
 - What/who made me smile today?
- Write a gratitude letter to somebody special, telling them why you are grateful they are in your life (if you're comfortable, text your letter to the person!)
- Have a family discussion around the dinner table, on the way to sports trainings etc. about the things that went well that day or made you smile/laugh.
