Bushfire readiness

In Term 4, we will be preparing the staff and students in case of a bushfire threat in our local community. At our recent Governing Council meeting, the 2024-25 Emergency Management policy was ratified.

On **Catastrophic Fire Ban** days our school is closed. You will be notified via a text message or phone call. If **a fire occurs on a bus run route**, that run will wait at school until the road is clear and parents will be notified via phone call or text message. Our school/preschool has detailed plans in place to keep your child safe in the event of a bushfire. To help us, parents and caregivers can prepare for the fire danger season by:

- providing us with your up-to-date contact details
- advising the school/preschool if your family's personal bushfire survival plan will impact school attendance
- talking to your child about what will happen in a bushfire emergency
- liking the CFS, SES and SAPOL pages on Facebook and activating notifications in their Apps
- adding the DFE emergency information hotline 1800 000 279 to your contacts.

Adelaide Show Camp

Kangaroo Inn Area School students have returned from the Adelaide Show in Week 7 with many achievements. KIAS students exhibited 6 Boer Field Goats purchased from Ronaldo Vrey and 6 wethers, which were kindly donated. Special thanks to the KIAS Ag Committee, Bob and Narelle Ballantyne, and especially to Tony Sornsek, who spent many hours feeding and looking after the goats and wethers.

A selection of Year 9, 10, and 11 students successfully exhibited 2x pens of three wethers. One team placed 9th, and the other team placed 14th out of over 175 teams for the best pen of three. Students learned about the selection on structural criteria and wool types, as well as handling skills that they displayed at the show.

The Year 7 and 8 students had great success exhibiting their goats this year. Alex received 1st place in his weight class, with Lachie coming in 2nd place. Leyla and Charlotte also received 2nd and 6th place for their classes. The students learned goat handling skills, the importance of weight gain, cooperation, and commitment skills. They enjoyed bonding with their goats over the past few terms and attending the Adelaide Show.

Cyber Safety Project



Last week we joined with Beachport and Rendelsham Primary schools to offer an online cyber safety webinar for parents to attend. The session focused on the areas of Plan, Prevent and Protect to support children and young people when using technology.

Plan: Do your research, build awareness and set boundaries

Prevent: Make use of device, app and game settings

Protect: Chat regularly and monitor your child's technology use

Top 5 Safety tips:

- Have regular conversations with your kids about cyber safety.
- Make a list of personal information your family never share online.
- Set up multi-factor authentication and strong passwords. Change them regularly.
- Use settings to your advantage. Set up their apps for safety and privacy.
- Help your kids build their network of trusted adults for help seeking.

The Non-Negotiables:

- No Screens in bedrooms or bathrooms.
- Devices always charged in a common area at night (locked away).
- Set screen time limits and ensure everyone sticks to them.
- Adhere to social media and gaming age recommendations/limits.

KIAS Emergency Action Plan - BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY Information for Families

Levels of fire alert

- Total Fire Ban declared in the district
- o Fire in Local District
- Temporary School Closure due to catastrophic bushfire weather conditions
- Fire in immediate vicinity or impacting on Site
- Recovery Phase immediately after a fire has impacted on the site

The following procedures ensure that students are kept safe, calm and supervised in the event of a fire threatening the school, in the vicinity of the school bus routes or our local district.

Some major points for Bushfire Emergencies

Catastrophic Bushfire Weather (code red)

- KIAS will be closed and buses will NOT run
- Staff will attempt to contact families as soon as a catastrophic day is declared

Fire threatening KIAS while school is open

- If Kangaroo Inn is threatened by a fire and evacuation is necessary the students will be moved to the Bushfire Refuge - KIAS HALL - PRINCIPAL SENDS GROUP TEXT TO FAMILIES
- A child can only be removed from the school by :-
 - a parent or previously nominated emergency contact
 - another person who parents have given signed, WRITTEN permission to take students from the site (dated the day of the fire/emergency)
 - Parent making personal phone contact with nominated staff member
 - Students cannot leave the site without these conditions being met.
 - Any adult removing a child must report to the Front Office Staff / Principal to enable accurate central records to be kept for the whereabouts of every child.
- The buses will not be released from the school unless the 'All Clear' for the route has been gained from the CFS Supervisor, Police or DfE - Bushfire and Emergency Management
- o Teachers will remain with the students until it is safe for them to go home
- Phone contact with the school may not be reliable. Details and updates will be provided by the CFS on the radio via the ABC 1161 AM or the CFS hotline / website
- On days of a total fire ban in the Lower South East fire ban district, a risk assessment will be considered by staff before any excursions, camps, meetings etc out of town are undertaken.
- The Principal or designated authority makes decisions. The delegated authority may be the Acting Principal or Fire Warden or Emergency Response Team.
